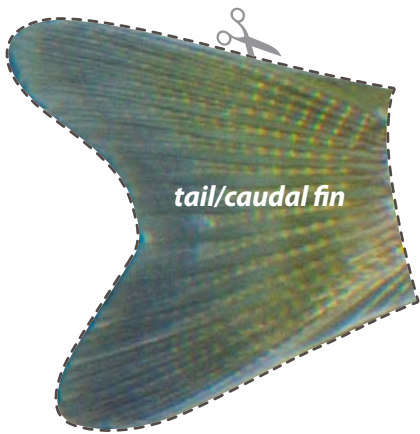
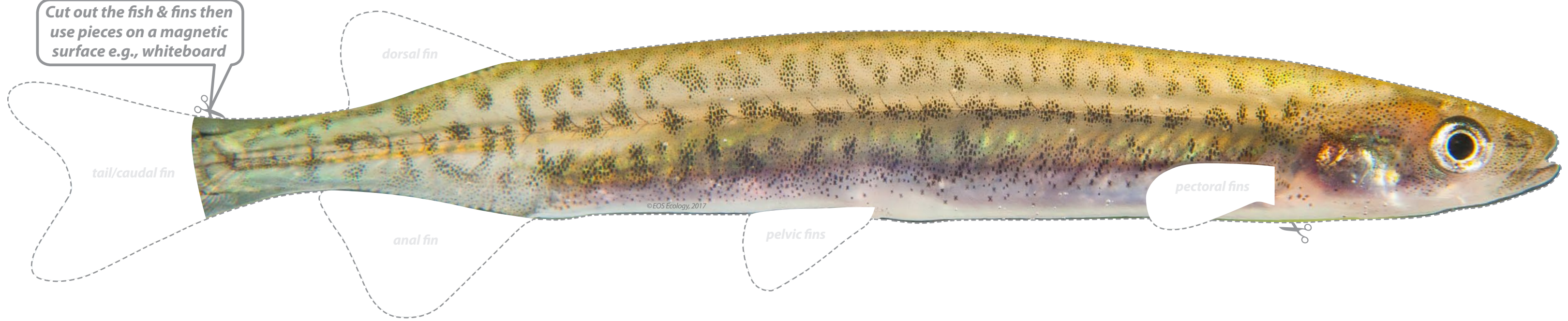


# Inanga/Whitebait – 'Pin the fin on the inanga' activity

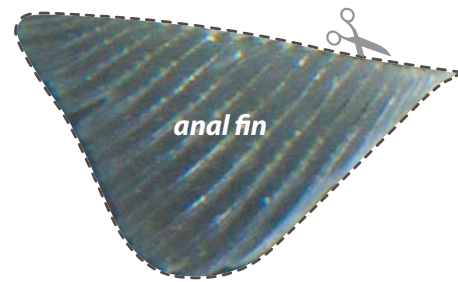
Cut out the fish & fins then use pieces on a magnetic surface e.g., whiteboard



tail/caudal fin

### tail or caudal fin

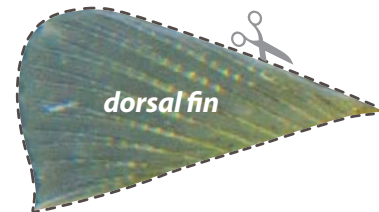
Located at the end of the body.



anal fin

### anal fin

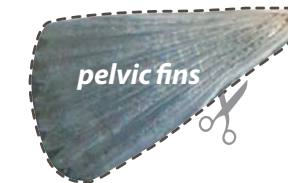
The anal fin is directly below the dorsal fin.



dorsal fin

### dorsal fin

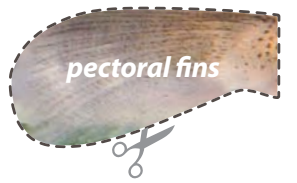
The dorsal fin starts directly above the anal fin.



pelvic fins

### 2x pelvic fins

There is one on each side of the inanga.



pectoral fins

### 2x pectoral fins

These are quite hard to see. There is one on each side of the inanga.

## 'Pin the fin on the inanga' activities...

### ACTIVITY ONE:

– Get children to guess where the fin fits on the inanga via its shape and name e.g., "This is the pectoral fin. On our bodies our pectoral muscles are up here on our chest...where do you think the inanga's pectoral fins will go?"

### ACTIVITY TWO:

– 'Pin the fin on the inanga'...our version of 'pin the tail on the donkey'. Cover the students eyes, turn them in a couple of circles, then see how close they place the tail fin to the right spot. Mark each student's attempt. The closest pinned tail wins!
